

Fòs Feminista Commitment



Narrative:

Fòs Feminista is an international alliance for sexual and reproductive health, rights, and justice that centers its work on women, girls, and gender-diverse people.

In 2020, we reached 2,389,248 people in 20 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean with rights-based, comprehensive interventions dedicated to sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR) that bolster individuals' autonomy, agency, and ability to lead healthy and fulfilling sexual and reproductive lives.

From 2022 to 2030, we will expand the reach of our SRHR interventions to 33,388,613 people in 21 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean by increasing the availability, accessibility, acceptability, and quality of comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services, contraceptive commodities, and comprehensive sexuality education, as well as advocating for laws and policies that dismantle barriers to sexual and reproductive health and rights.

Outcomes:

1. During 2020, we provided 1,433,879 Couple Years of Protection (CYP) for people in 20 countries in Latin America and the Caribbean. By 2030, we commit to expand contraceptive coverage in 21 countries by delivering more than 36,891,998 cumulative CYPs through the scale-up of Fòs Feminista's innovative social enterprise for SRHR commodities (INNOVA), which enables timely, consistent access to a wide contraceptive method mix, including long-acting reversible contraceptives (LARCs), to ensure contraceptive choice and respect for bodily autonomy.
2. In 2020, we provided 2,038,484 women and girls in 20 Latin American and Caribbean countries with comprehensive, rights-based sexual and reproductive health (SRH) care, including contraceptive services. By 2030, access to quality, integrated SRH care will be extended to 25,649,748 women, girls, and gender-diverse populations in 21 countries, taking into consideration intersectional inequalities that affect access to support their SRHR decision making and autonomy, as well as to provide a link to contraception through a range of SRH services, when desired. This will be achieved by strengthening and expanding our alliances with feminist organizations that provide SRH services, particularly those reaching women and girls impacted by intersectional inequities, leveraging person-centered innovations (such as digital health interventions and self-managed care models), and developing a communications strategy for engaging and listening to women who are underserved, particularly the most vulnerable.
3. In 2020, we ensured that 136,077 adolescents and young people accessed quality and inclusive comprehensive sexuality education (CSE). From 2022 to 2030, CSE will be expanded through formal and non-formal educational settings, reaching a total of 5,176,352 young people in 21 Latin American and Caribbean countries to enhance their wellbeing by bolstering knowledge and skills for informed decision making about their sexual and reproductive health. We plan to achieve this by developing educational and evaluation tools for CSE, cultivating a robust network of partners to facilitate quality, inclusive CSE in the Latin American and Caribbean region, partnering with Ministries of Education to share CSE videos, and conducting research on CSE restrictions in the region to generate evidence for advocacy on public policies.

4. Annually, Fòs Feminista contributes to 30 legislative and policy changes in support of SRHR. By 2030, we aim to support a total of 270 legislative and policy changes that create an enabling environment for women, girls, and gender-diverse people to exercise their sexual and reproductive rights. This will be achieved through the design and implementation of a regional evidence-based advocacy and litigation strategy for the promotion of sexual and reproductive health and rights. Driven by two Fòs Feminista partner-led Centers – the Center for Evidence-Based Advocacy and the Center for Legal Responses – this strategy will positively impact the legislative environment in over 21 countries in Latin America and Caribbean.
